



Medication Treatment for Opioid Use Disorder

Training Workshop | September 2019

Course description:

This training will provide treatment staff, recovery coaches, peer specialists, and recovery volunteers with a deeper understanding of issues faced by individuals struggling with an opioid use disorder, and the treatment and recovery options available to them. The content includes: opioid use disorder conceptualization (criteria for the diagnosis, the course of the disorder, common patterns of use); models of treatment (including effective medications and treatment modalities); and a review of evidence that both underscores the opioid epidemic, and provides support for treatment with medications. The format will be a combination of presentations, small group case review, and larger group discussions emphasizing the practices of providing evidence-based treatment.

Course objectives:

Attendees of this training will be able to apply knowledge gained from the training to:

- Describe diagnostic features, drug use patterns and trajectory of opioid use disorders.
- Understand the evidence-based treatment options available for individuals with an opioid use disorder.
- Inform treatment and service plans for patients/clients/peers with an opioid use disorder.
